

4-H CAMP ANNOUNCEMENT

The Virginia Beach 4-H Junior Camp for youth 9-13 years old will be held August 3-7, 2020 at the Airfield 4-H Center in Wakefield, VA. This fun-filled week will be packed with exciting classes and activities as well as a nightly closing campfire. Usually we have a long waiting list right before camp, so make sure you register early. The cost for camp this year will be approximately \$350 and includes transportation to and from camp, a camp tshirt, meals, lodging, special activities and programs. Camper registrations will open on December 13 just in time for that special holiday gift to your favorite camper. The 4-H Office will post the registration information on the website and e-mail to 2019 Campers.

The application for 4-H Camp teen staff will be posted on the Virginia Beach website mid-November and is due January 31, 2020. Teens must be 14 as of January 1, 2020 to 19 years of age to apply for a counselor or counselor-in-training position. Teens must attend 24 hours of training, go through an interview process and attend Training Weekend May 2-3, 2020 at Airfield in order to be considered for the positions. Monthly trainings will begin in February 2020. **Reminder -** The Outstanding City-wide 4-H Club Member Application was revised and is posted on the 4-H website.

Club members will be eligible for many distinguished awards, i.e., Outstanding City-Wide Award, Herbert W. Ozlin Award and the "I Dare You" Award. These applications are due **December 2st** to the 4-H Office or online.

VIRGINIA BEACH 4-H COUNTRY CURED HAM PROJECT



It's that time again to start one of the most popular 4-H projects in Virginia Beach! We'll begin taking registrations for the 2020 4-H country cured ham project in November. Last year 204 hams were cured. Again in the upcoming season, youth participants will be given priority registration consideration. Any hams left will be open to adult participants with a limit of 2 hams per person. The project tentatively begins on January 18, 2020 with several other follow-up dates scheduled from January through May to complete the project. There will not be a plant tour at Smithfield.

VIRGINIA 4-H YOUTH IN ACTION AWARDS

The State 4-H Office is offering an exciting award opportunity for 4-H'ers across Virginia. You all have likely seen the information over the last couple of months about the National Youth in Action Awards sponsored by National 4-H Council. To provide a similar system for our state, and to encourage high quality applications for the national awards, the State 4-H Office has established the Virginia Youth in Action Awards Program.

Extension Agents in each county/city are asked to nominate 4-H members in the pillar areas of Agriculture, Civic Engagement, Healthy Living, and STEM. One pillar winner will be chosen from each area, as well as an overall state winner from the four pillar winners. Any 4-H member in Virginia ages 15-18 is eligible to be nominated.

Each of the four winners will receive:

- A \$500 mini-grant to develop a significant community project.
- Recognition at a formal award ceremony in Richmond on Wednesday, February 5, 2020.
- A full scholarship to attend Virginia State 4-H Congress, June 21-25, 2020, in Blacksburg, VA.
- An opportunity to be featured as the Virginia 4-H Youth Spokesperson for their pillar area.
- Support and mentorship to apply for the 2021 National 4-H Youth Leadership Awards.
- An official reference letter from the Virginia State 4-H Program Leader, Jeremy C. Johnson

If you feel you are eligible to receive this award, please contact Virginia Beach 4-H Agent, Sarah Farley (<u>sfarley@vbgov.com</u>) to begin the process for the nomination. A short video recorded by the nominee is required. There is no limit to the amount of nominations that can be submitted in Virginia Beach, however a 4-H member can only be nominated for one pillar area.

4-H HAND + SEED: GROWING URBAN ENTREPRENEURS PROGRAM

Virginia Beach and Norfolk 4-H Agents, Sarah Farley and Theran Teach have been working to jumpstart a new 4-H program in Coastal Virginia called the *4-H Hand* + *Seed: Growing Urban Entrepreneurs Program*. Grounded in the quintessential human desire to shape the conditions under which we live and work, the program aims to provide a viable alternative for social mobility by placing youth-led cooperatives at the forefront of entrepreneurial education.

True to 4-H's historic model of "learning by doing," the pilot program is designed as a hands-on experiential simulation. Youth will collectively produce herbs and flowers while democratically designing value-added product(s) for a corporate CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) subscription. Examples may include cut flowers and herb-infused baked goods. Through this process, youth will nurture entrepreneurial mindsets while exercising the values of cooperative philosophy.

The program has received two state awards – a Virginia 4-H Foundation Innovative Programming Award and Virginia Association of Extension 4-H Agents Mini-Grant. These awards help with supplies and program startup costs. However, additional community support and in-kind donations are needed. **Registration for the 4-H Hand + Seed: Growing Urban Entrepreneurs Program** will **open in December. Interested youth, ages 12-19 are encouraged to contact the 4-H Office to be added to our list.**

4-H CRAFT CLUB

The Craft Club started the 2019-2020 4- H year with an emphasis on the 4-H Pledge. We welcomed several new members to our first meeting. Elections were conducted and the following officers were elected: Lily-President, Reagan-Vice President, Faye-Secretary and Emmett-Treasurer. Club members assembled a picture frame with the 4-H Pledge and a 4-H Friendship bracelet.

Also during National 4-H week, we participated in Crunch Heard Around the Commonwealth to celebrate the importance of farms and farmers in our state. Everyone at our center took a bite out of an apple, but the Urban Knights also participated in an activity about apple genetics. We used 3 types of apples, Braeburn, Royal Gala, and Jazz. We observed the physical features, then cut them, counted the seeds, smelled them and finally tasted them. We learned about dominant and recessive traits and how to use Punnett Squares to figure out the percentage of when the traits show up. It was cool to see how traits from the parent types show up in the hybrid types.
